Dr. Theodore C. Kariotis is a professor of economics with more than 25 years of teaching experience, and have received three teaching awards from University of Maryland University College. He has also taught at Towson University, George Mason University, and George Washington University. He is one of the first professors in the United States to teach Economics online and one of the few professors that has created video lectures for his online students in Macroeconomics. One thing that his students find of interest is not that he has three degrees in Economics but that he has received them from three different countries (Greece, Canada, and the United States).

Dr. Kariotis' most important book is Greece and the Law of the Sea.

He has served as the Economic Counselor of the Embassy of Greece in Washington and he was a member of the delegation of Greece to the United Nations Conference on the Law of the Sea. He is an expert on the concept of the Exclusive Economic Zone and has written books and articles on that issue in both Greek and English.
